COVID-19 ECONOMIC RELIEF FOR SMALL BUSINESSES



The following state and federal programs and resources are available to assist small businesses, venues, and restaurants with reopening, recovery, and resilience in the face of the economic challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Funds for certain programs are limited, and affected businesses are encouraged to apply soon.

1 SBA COVID-19 EIDL

The Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) can help pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could not be paid due to COVID-19. Available through **December 31**. Visit https://covid19relief.sba.gov/#/ to apply.



2 FEDERAL EMPLOYEE RETENTION TAX CREDIT

The Federal Employee Retention Tax Credit is a credit of 70% of qualified wages per employee for employers that fully or partially suspended operations due to COVID-19. Active through the **end of 2021**. Visit https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/employee-retention-credit for more information.



3 SBA DEBT RELIEF

The SBA will pay the principal and interest of current 7(a) loans approved prior to **September 27**, **2020** for a period of six months. Additional debt relief payments may be available. Assistance is subject to available federal funding.

The Shuttered Venues Grant offers up to 45% (capped at \$10 million) of 2019 gross earned revenue for shuttered live performance spaces in operation prior to **February 29, 2020**. 5 SBA RESTAURANT REVITALIZATION FUND

The Restaurant Revitalization Fund provided restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue losses up to \$10 million per business. Available funds have been exhausted, but legislation to refund the program has been proposed. 6 FEDERAL TAX CREDIT FOR VACCINATIONS

Eligible employers are entitled to tax credits for wages paid for employee leave taken due to reasons related to COVID-19, including for preventative vaccinations.
