Tree Options

DOGWOOD

- North Carolina State Flower
- Blooms early in the spring, looks fantastic all year round
- Attractive to Pollinators and fruits attract various species of birds
- Prefers partial shade for optimal growth
- Low maintenance when it comes to pruning

FRINGE

- Have a three-season appeal.
- Blooms in late spring and early summer.
- In summer, it attracts birds with its bluish-black fruits.
- In fall, leaves turn bright yellow, adding seasonal beauty.



GEM MAGNOLIA

- Slow-growing, reaching up to 20 feet.
- Glossy green leaves with fragrant flowers.

Drought tolerant and tolerant to winterization road sprayed salt.

REDBUD

- Beautiful pink to reddish purple flowers
- Heart-shaped leaves
- Drought tolerant with minimal maintenance
- Attracts bees and butterflies
- Seed pods provide food for birds and other wildlife

SERVICEBERRY

- Berries are ready to pick when dark, purple-blue
- Serviceberry fruit is delicious straight from the tree and can be used like blueberries: smoothies, muffins, pancakes, jellies, jams, and ice cream.
- A favorite among birds and butterflies, providing a habitat and food source
- Resilient and require minimal maintenance
- Known for early, white spring flowers, and outstanding, orange fall foliage
- Grows best in full to partial sun
