
Communications Center Calls & Calls for Service

Dispatched Calls for Service are incidents officers respond to after a call has been placed to the Communications Center.

Self-Initiated Calls for Service are incidents officers observe in the field and/or take actions upon without a call to the Communications Center.

62,584 total CFS in 2023


















